Nearest AED (when no ATC present): Door 12 - wall unit on Main Hallway, just past the Weight Room

Emergency Supplies Available (when ATC present): First Aid Supplies, AED, Crutches, Splints, EpiPen

***In the event emergency medical services are required, the following plan should be followed:**

- Certified Athletic Trainer (Kristyn Wharton, Brittany Arndt, etc.) will provide immediate care for the athlete and alert the respective team coach to activate EMS by calling 911 from their cell phone.
 - o *If no ATC at the Baseball Field*, a coach will provide immediate first aid and assistant coach/teammate/designee will get the AT from the Athletic Training Room (Contact #s listed above, Door 10 - Room G101)
 - o *If no ATC on campus at the time of the incident*, the coach will call EMS and provide immediate care until EMS arrives. He/she/they must notify Kristyn Wharton once EMS takes over care for the athlete
- EMS will be given the following instructions to access the Baseball Field:
 - o Address is 9200 Burke Lake Rd.
 - o From Burke Road, take a left at the entrance to the school and then a right at your first turning opportunity. Continue down until you see the Baseball Field on your right. Enter at the corner of the parking lot and follow the paved walkway to the field.
 - o A school employee must meet EMS at the gate and escort to the field.
- Once EMS is on the scene, the coach must retrieve the athlete's Emergency Care Form and inform EMS of any medical conditions, allergies, or medications.
- ATC/Coach/Designee must notify the emergency contact listed on the student-athlete's Emergency Care Form and provide information on where the athlete will be taken for treatment.
- Administrators/Coaches/Designee will provide crowd control to ensure medical professionals have a clear area to care for the student-athlete and answer any questions they may have.
- Once EMS has left the building, Kristyn Wharton and Janice Pritchett must be notified immediately.

* **Yellow circles** indicate gates that must be opened for ambulance

* **Green line** indicates foot access to Baseball Field

COMMUNITY USE Emergency Action Plan Baseball Field

***In the event emergency medical services are required, the following plan should be followed:**

- If there is a Certified Athletic Trainer on-site/working the event, they will provide immediate care for the athlete and alert the respective team coach to activate EMS by calling 911 from their cell phone.
 - o *If no ATC on-site/working the event*, the coach will call EMS and provide immediate care until EMS arrives. Put phone on speaker if providing care alone.
- EMS will be given the following instructions to access the Baseball Field:
 - o Address is 9200 Burke Lake Rd.
 - o From Burke Road, take a left at the entrance to the school and then a right at your first turning opportunity. Continue down until you see the Baseball Field on your right. Enter at the corner of the parking lot and follow the paved walkway to the field.
- A coach/designee must meet EMS at the gate and escort to the field.
- Coach/Designee must notify the parent/emergency contact and provide information on where the athlete will be taken for treatment if parent is not on-site.
- Coaches/Designee will provide crowd control to ensure medical professionals have a clear area to care for the student-athlete and answer any questions they may have.
